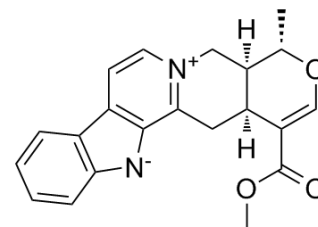

BIOLOGICAL ACTIVITY

Description	Alstonine is a major indole alkaloid compound of a plant-based remedy. Alstonine has antipsychotic, anxiolytic, anticancer and antimalarial properties ^[1] .
In Vitro	Alstonine has the capacity to distinguish cancer DNA from healthy tissue DNA; it inhibits DNA in vitro synthesis when DNA from different cancerous tissues or cells is used as template. Practically without effects on DNA from healthy tissues ^[1] . MCE has not independently confirmed the accuracy of these methods. They are for reference only.
In Vivo	In mice models Alstonine shows a clear, dose-dependent, potent antipsychotic profile. Alstonine (i.p.) prevents amphetamine-induced lethality, with active doses within the range of 0.5-2.0 mg/kg ^[1] . Alstonine (0.1, 0.5 and 1.0 mg/kg) prevents MK-801 induced hyperlocomotion. Because Alstonine partially reverses MK-801-induced increase in locomotion both at the hole-board and locomotor activity cages ^[1] . Alstonine successfully treats a relatively important proportion of BALB/C mice inoculated with transplantable YC8 lymphoma ascites cells as well as Swiss mice bearing Ehrlich ascites carcinoma cells ^[1] .
