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Description	Dinoprost- ¹³ C ₅ is ¹³ C labeled Dinoprost (HY-12956). Dinoprost (Prostaglandin F2α) is an orally active, potent prostaglandin F (PGF) receptor (FP receptor) agonist. Dinoprost is a luteolytic hormone produced locally in the endometrial luminal epithelium and corpus luteum (CL). Dinoprost plays a key role in the onset and progression of labour ^{[1][2]} .		
In Vitro	Stable heavy isotopes of hydrogen, carbon, and other elements have been incorporated into drug molecules, largely as tracers for quantitation during the drug development process. Deuteration has gained attention because of its potential to affect the pharmacokinetic and metabolic profiles of drugs ^[1] . Dinoprost (Prostaglandin F2α; 1 μM; for 24 hours) induces ER stress, autophagy, and apoptosis in goat luteal cells ^[2] . ?Dinoprost (1 μM; for 24 hours) significantly increases the expression of GRP78 and UPR sensors ^[2] . MCE has not independently confirmed the accuracy of these methods. They are for reference only.
