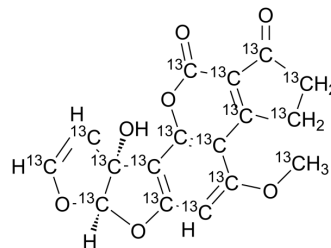

BIOLOGICAL ACTIVITY

Description	Aflatoxin M1- ¹³ C ₁₇ is the ¹³ C labeled Aflatoxin M1 (HY-N6699) ^[1] . Aflatoxin M1 is a major metabolite of Aflatoxin B1. Aflatoxin M1 is a mycotoxin produced by the fungi <i>Aspergillus flavus</i> and <i>Aspergillus parasiticus</i> . The level of toxicity associated with Aflatoxin is Aflatoxin B1>Aflatoxin M1>Aflatoxin G1>Aflatoxin B2>Aflatoxin M2>Aflatoxin G2 ^[2] .
In Vitro	Stable heavy isotopes of hydrogen, carbon, and other elements have been incorporated into drug molecules, largely as tracers for quantitation during the drug development process. Deuteration has gained attention because of its potential to affect the pharmacokinetic and metabolic profiles of drugs ^[1] . MCE has not independently confirmed the accuracy of these methods.
