Formulation	Supplied as a 0.22 µm filtered solution of 50 mM Tris-HCl, pH7.5, 200 mM NaCl, 20% glycerol.

DESCRIPTION

Background	<p>The GNPDA2 protein assumes a crucial role in cellular metabolism by catalyzing the reversible conversion of alpha-D-glucosamine 6-phosphate (GlcN-6P) into beta-D-fructose 6-phosphate (Fru-6P) and ammonium ion. This enzymatic reaction represents a regulatory step in de novo uridine diphosphate-N-acetyl-alpha-D-glucosamine (UDP-GlcNAc) biosynthesis through the hexosamine pathway. The deamination process is coupled to aldo-keto isomerization, mediating the metabolic flux from UDP-GlcNAc toward Fru-6P. Particularly noteworthy is GNPDA2's capability, under high ammonium levels, to drive amination and isomerization of Fru-6P, promoting hexosamine and UDP-GlcNAc synthesis. This dynamic interplay highlights GNPDA2's role in fine-tuning the metabolic fluctuations of cytosolic UDP-GlcNAc, influencing hyaluronan synthesis during tissue remodeling. The enzyme's regulatory function underscores its significance in coordinating metabolic pathways critical for nucleotide biosynthesis and cellular homeostasis.</p>
