Appearance	Lyophilized powder.
Formulation	Lyophilized from a 0.22 µm filtered solution of PBS, pH 7.4. Normally 5% trehalose is added as protectant before lyophilization.
Endotoxin Level	<1 EU/µg, determined by LAL method.
Reconstitution	It is not recommended to reconstitute to a concentration less than 100 µg/mL in ddH ₂ O.
Storage & Stability	Stored at -20°C for 2 years. After reconstitution, it is stable at 4°C for 1 week or -20°C for longer (with carrier protein). It is recommended to freeze aliquots at -20°C or -80°C for extended storage.
Shipping	Room temperature in continental US; may vary elsewhere.

DESCRIPTION

Background	SIRP Beta 1 Protein, an immunoglobulin-like cell surface receptor, plays a crucial role in negatively regulating receptor tyrosine kinase-coupled signaling processes. This receptor modulates cellular responses induced by various stimuli, including cell adhesion, growth factors, or insulin. Through its regulatory functions, SIRP Beta 1 contributes to maintaining cellular homeostasis and finely tuning the activation of signaling pathways associated with receptor tyrosine kinases.
