Description	Levoglucosan- 13 C ₆ is the 13 C labeled Levoglucosan[1]. Levoglucosan (1,6-Anhydro- β -D-glucopyranose) is an anhydrosugar produced through glucan pyrolysis and is widely found in nature[2].
In Vitro	Stable heavy isotopes of hydrogen, carbon, and other elements have been incorporated into drug molecules, largely as tracers for quantitation during the drug development process. Deuteration has gained attention because of its potential to affect the pharmacokinetic and metabolic profiles of drugs ^[1] . MCE has not independently confirmed the accuracy of these methods.
